From Rt. 2:

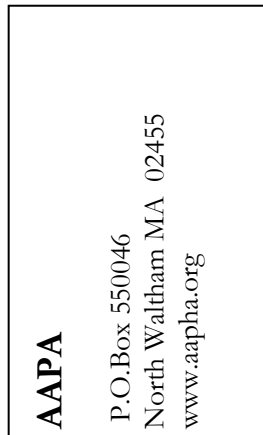
